# **Planning Application Likely To Have Significant Environmental Effects On Northern Ireland Planning Application Accompanied by an Environmental Statement**

## **Regulation 30 of The Planning (EIA) Regulations (NI) 2017**

The Department has received notification of a planning application accompanied by an Environmental Statement for the following development which is likely to have significant effects on the environment in Northern Ireland. This application has been submitted to Cavan County Council.

**Location:** Aughrim, Mucklagh, Gortoorlan and Snugborough, Ballyconnell, Co. Cavan

**Proposal:** Planning permission for development at Aughrim Mucklagh Quarry Complex for the continuation of quarrying on some of the lands covered by a previous time limited planning consent PL02.206783 to include extraction from two distinct limestone quarries and a shale quarry, with progressive restoration of the development site and the complete rehabilitation of a former shale quarry, over a 20 year period. The development includes lateral development of the two limestone quarries and a shale quarry employing existing practices, environmental mitigation measures and associated works extending over some 60 hectares of the 107.7 hectare site.
